(c) For the purposes of this Section, "political subdivision" also includes public or private entities that provide natural resources, including drinking water, and subject to health, safety, and welfare standards administered by the Department of Health and Hospitals, the Department of Environmental Quality, or the Public Service Commission.

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(d) In addition to either of the determinations in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph, in determining whether to file a rule to appoint a fiscal administrator of a political subdivision as defined in Subparagraph (A)(1)(c) of this Section, the decision shall be by a majority decision of the legislative auditor, the attorney general, and the state treasurer at a public meeting upon the finding that the political subdivision is incapable, either due to lack of financial stability or inadequate operable fixtures and equipment, of providing necessary natural resources, such as drinking water, for the remainder of the current fiscal year and the next fiscal year to the residents to which the political subdivision is obligated to provide such service. The public meeting shall be properly noticed in the official journal of the parish in which the political subdivision is located.

*

B.(1) The trial court shall appoint a fiscal administrator in the following instances:

*

(c) If a political subdivision as defined in Subparagraph (A)(1)(c) of this Section is incapable, either due to lack of financial stability or inadequate operable fixtures and equipment, of providing necessary natural resources, such as drinking water, for the remainder of the current fiscal year and the next fiscal year to the residents to which the political subdivision is obligated to provide such service.

D. In cases where a fiscal administrator is appointed for a political subdivision pursuant to Subparagraph (B)(1)(c) of this Section, the fiscal administrator's duties as provided in this Chapter shall be limited to those necessary to provide the natural resource. Should the trial court later appoint a fiscal administrator pursuant to Subparagraph (B)(1)(a) or (b), the trial court shall either affirm the current appointment or appoint a person recommended by the legislative auditor and the attorney as provided in this Section. If the political subdivision is a private entity, the fiscal administrator shall limit his duties to an advisory capacity. Upon appointment, notice shall be published in the official journal of the parish in which the political subdivision is located and the fiscal administrator shall receive public comment either through writing or by properly noticed public meetings. The appointment of the fiscal administrator provided for in this Subsection may be terminated upon a majority vote of the legislative auditor, the attorney general, and the state treasurer at a public meeting and, if such appointment is terminated the trial court shall be notified.'

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
