D. A violation of the provisions of this Section shall constitute a deceptive and unfair trade practice and subject the violator to any and all actions and penalties authorized in this Chapter. Each offer in violation of this Section shall be considered a separate offense.

For the purposes of this Section, "extended service agreement" shall include any vehicle mechanical breakdown insurance policy, vehicle service contract sold by an independent payment provider or their agent, or vehicle component coverage contract. "Unsolicited offer" shall not include an offer made subsequent to a prior personal contact that included a meaningful exchange between the offeror and offeree.'

For each taxable year in which an offset authorized by this Subsection is taken, the amount of the offset shall not exceed the amount of the state corporate income or franchise tax liability against which the offset is taken after application of all income or corporation franchise tax credits. The secretary shall authorize an extension of time not to exceed two years within which an offset may be taken if payment of the amount of the total claim approved is not satisfied after four years.
- (3) A party for which the secretary has authorized an offset pursuant to this Subsection may transfer the offset to a member of the party's affiliated group included in the federal consolidated return filed under the Internal Revenue Code. Any offset transferred to a member of the federal consolidated group shall only be allowed as an offset against the same taxes and shall be subject to the same limitations provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection. The transfer

shall be in accordance with the procedures set forth by rule or on forms or instructions provided by the secretary.
