AN ACT

To amend and reenact Sections 20 and 23 of Act No. 305 of the 1978 Regular Session of the Legislature, as amended by Act No. 657 of the 1979 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 99 of the 1980 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 9 of the 1980 Second Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, Act No. 287 of the 1982 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 572 of the 1984 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 390 of the 1987 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 43 of the 1992 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 1013 of the 1993 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act Nos. 13 and 42 of the 1994 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act Nos. 1174 and 1176 of the 1997 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 72 of the 2002 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, and Act No. 557 of the 2014 Regular Session of the Legislature, all relative to the Ernest N. Morial-New Orleans Exhibition Hall Authority; to provide relative to the taxing authority and bonding capacity of the Authority; to restrict the power granted to the Authority to levy certain hotel occupancy and food and beverage taxes and to issue bonds to finance certain expansion projects; and to provide for related matters.

# HOUSE BILL NO. 623— BY REPRESENTATIVE HILFERTY

AN ACT

To enact Subpart M of Part I of Chapter 7 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 33:3675.51, relative to the city of New Orleans; to create the New Orleans Street Maintenance District; to provide relative to the boundaries, purpose, governance, and funding of the district, including the authority to levy a hotel occupancy and a food and beverage tax; to provide relative to the powers and duties of the district and its governing board; and to provide for related matters.

Read by title.

Under the rules, the above bill was referred to the Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs.

## HOUSE BILL NO. 624— BY REPRESENTATIVE HENRY

AN ACT

To provide with respect to the Revenue Sharing Fund and the allocation and distribution thereof for Fiscal Year 2017-2018; and to provide for related matters.

### **HOUSE BILL NO. 625-**

BY REPRESENTATIVE HENRY

AN ACT

appropriate funds and to make certain reductions in appropriations from certain sources to be allocated to designated agencies and purposes in specific amounts for the making of supplemental appropriations for Fiscal Year 2016-2017; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE BILL NO. 626—
BY REPRESENTATIVE TALBOT AND SENATOR MARTINY
AN ACT
To amend and reenact R.S. 32:707(L)(2) and to enact R.S. 47:305.72 and Chapter 4-B of Subtitle II of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 47:552, relative to taxes on certain types of motor vehicles; to impose a state and local tax on the issuance of a certificate of title for certain antique, classic, or vintage motor vehicles; to provide for the collection and enforcement of the tax; to establish an exemption from state and local sales and use taxes for the sale or use of antique, classic, or vintage motor vehicles; to provide for an effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE BILL NO. 257— BY REPRESENTATIVE HOLLIS

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing to add Article VI, Section 10.1 to the Constitution of Louisiana, to prohibit the governing authority of a parish and
