The processing fee shall be for the costs of the employer in complying with the judgment of garnishment.

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C.D. In garnishment proceedings in which the employee is a state officer or employee, the processing fee provided by Subsection B shall be paid into the state treasury and, in accordance with Article VII, Section 9 of the Constitution of Louisiana, shall be credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund."



The costs of background checks shall be borne either by the volunteer or its affiliated volunteer agency.
