"(c) No taxpayer, or any entity affiliated with such taxpayer, shall claim more than five million dollars of credit annually for any number of structures rehabilitated with a particular downtown development or cultural district. The maximum amount of tax credits that may be claimed by all taxpayers pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall not exceed one hundred fifty million dollars annually. Tax credits shall be paid by the Department of Revenue on a first-come, first-served basis, and all credits received on the last day in which the maximum amount of credits is reached shall be reduced on a pro rata basis so as not to exceed the maximum amount of credits authorized to be claimed in any one year.
