- (6) The Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget shall meet no later than January thirty-first of each year to approve the Joint Legislative Committee on Technology and Cybersecurity's project recommendations and allocate monies from the fund for the approved Approval shall require a majority vote of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget. Prior to approval, the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget may delete projects from the recommendation list. In no event shall it add any projects to the list, nor shall it make substitutions for projects which have been removed without approval from the Joint Legislative Committee on Technology and Cybersecurity."

- (6) Organizing primary and secondary school education campaigns to prevent opioid use, including for administrative expenses.
- (7) Enforcing the laws regarding opioid prescriptions and sales, including for administrative expenses.
- (8) Research and training for substance use treatment and overdose prevention, including for administrative expenses.
- (9) Supporting and expanding evidence-based interventions for substance abuse treatment and overdose prevention.
- E. The fund is in addition to any monies appropriated to any agency and is not intended to take the place of funding that otherwise would be appropriated for the programs or services.
- F. Except as specified in Subsection D of this Section, money expended from the fund may not be used for administrative expenses.
- G. The governor, in consultation with the attorney general and legislature, shall develop a plan for the allocation of monies in the fund in accordance with Subsection D of this Section. The governor shall submit the plan and the proposed budget to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget for approval no later than January 1, 2021."
