- (3) The rebate authorized by this Section shall apply only to the first purchase of each enumerated item by an individual taxpayer. Each subsequent purchase of any enumerated item by the same taxpayer shall not be eligible for the rebate.
- B. Requests for the rebates of state sales and use taxes pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be processed by the Department of Revenue. A purchaser shall claim a state rebate using the form and in the manner prescribed by the Department of Revenue. The purchaser who claims a rebate shall submit documentation to the secretary of the Department of Revenue evidencing the purchase of fiber-optic cable equipment and documentation evidencing the purchaser is a winning bidder that was awarded a census block by the Federal Communications Commission in the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund Auction. The secretary of the Department of Revenue shall promulgate rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act as are necessary to implement the
