The exemption shall last for a period of twenty-four months or until payout of the well cost is achieved, whichever occurs first.

(2)(a) Payout of well cost occurs when gross revenue from the well, less royalties and operating costs directly attributable to the well, equals the well cost.

(b) For the purposes of this Section, well costs shall equal the cost of completing the well to the commencement of production or the cost of well enhancements, as determined by the Department of Natural Resources.

(c) For the purposes of this Section, operating costs shall be limited to those costs directly attributable to the operation of the exempt well, including but not limited to direct materials, supplies, fuel, direct labor, contract labor or services, repairs, maintenance, property taxes, insurance, depreciation, and any other costs that can be directly attributed to the operation of the well. Where applicable, the calculation of such costs shall begin from the date that the Department of Natural Resources permitted operation or enhancement is complete and production is established. Operating costs shall not include any costs that were included in the well cost approved by the Office of Conservation.

(3) Interest on a refund of severance tax to an operator whose well qualifies for the exemption provided in this Subsection shall be paid in accordance with R.S. 47:1624(A)(2)."
