I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION

House Bill No. 199 of the 2021 Regular Session by Representative Schexnayder, proposes to add Article VII, Section 3.1 of the Constitution of Louisiana.

Creates the State and Local Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Commission, establishes membership of the commission, establishes duties of the commission, provides for funding for the commission, provides for the abolishment of the La. Sales and Use Tax Commission for Remote Sellers and the La. Uniform Local Sales Tax Board, and provides for legislative enactment of laws relative to the membership, duties, or obligations of the commission by 2/3 vote.

II. CONSTITUTIONAL NECESSITY

Parts of the proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

III. PROPOSED ELECTION DATE

The proposed election date at which the proposition is to be submitted to the voters is November 8, 2022, which should ensure maximum voter turnout, to the extent practicable.
