Any agreements between the healthcare provider and a third party responsible for the financing or collection of medical expenses,

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including but not limited to a letter of protection or guarantee of payment between the healthcare provider and an attorney, shall be admissible evidence. The trier of fact shall make the determination of the amount of medical expenses to award, if any, after consideration of all evidence presented.

Section 2. R.S. 9:2800.27(E) through (G) are hereby repealed in their entirety."
