Subject to the approval of the register of the State Land Office, and with the concurrence of the attorney general, the political body who has been granted a lease under the provisions of this Chapter may place improvements in and on the leased property, and after obtaining approval of the register may assign or sublease such lease; provided, however, that any political body subleasing or assigning its lease as herein authorized shall supervise its sublessee or assign to insure that the terms and conditions of the original lease are observed, and provided, further, such assignment or sublease shall be only to the highest responsible bidder after advertisement in accordance with R.S. 41:1213 through 1215.1.

Any lease made by the register of the State Land Office pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall be on behalf of the state of Louisiana except that, as to any lake, bay, cove and the bed and bottom thereof and land reclaimed therefrom, or part thereof, not under the jurisdiction and control of the state of Louisiana, the lease shall be made on behalf of the political body or entity having such jurisdiction and control and only at its request.

B. No person or entity shall provide electronic monitoring services within this state unless such person or entity is registered with the commission.

C. An electronic monitoring provider applying for registration shall submit an application on forms provided by the commission and shall certify in writing all of the following:

(1) The provider has reviewed and understands the provisions of R.S. 15:571.36 and all applicable laws governing electronic monitoring.

(2) The provider agrees to comply with all statutory requirements and rules adopted pursuant to this Section.

(3) The equipment and monitoring systems utilized by the provider meet the standards and operational requirements established by law.

(4) The provider maintains the operational capability to monitor individuals, detect violations, and report such violations in accordance with law.

D. The provider shall provide identifying business information, including ownership and principal place of business, designate a registered agent within this state, and submit to criminal background checks for owners and principal operators.

E. Electronic monitoring providers shall retain all monitoring records, violation records, device status records, and related documentation for a minimum of five years and shall make such records available upon lawful request by a court, law enforcement agency, prosecutorial authority, or other authorized entity.

F. Electronic monitoring providers shall comply with any reporting, data-sharing, or system participation requirements established by law or by rule of the commission including participation in any centralized monitoring or oversight system established by the state.

G. The commission shall maintain the registration status of each electronic monitoring provider. The commission shall deny, suspend, or revoke the registration of a provider only upon receipt of official documentation of any of the following:

(1) The provider or its owner has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, a felony offense or any offense directly related to fraud, public safety, or the provision of electronic monitoring services.

(2) The provider has been found, by a final administrative or judicial determination, to be in violation of the provisions of this Section or rules adopted pursuant to this Section.

H. Any denial, suspension, or revocation shall be conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, including notice and an opportunity for hearing.

I. The commission shall not independently investigate criminal conduct of electronic monitoring providers. If the commission receives information or has reason to believe that a provider is not in compliance with the provisions of this Section, the commission shall notify the appropriate prosecutorial authority, law enforcement agency, or court of competent jurisdiction for review and any action deemed appropriate.

J. Upon the entry of a conviction or issuance of a final administrative or judicial determination involving an electronic monitoring provider related to fraud, public safety, or the provision of monitoring services, notice of such action may be transmitted to the commission by a court of competent jurisdiction, the office of the attorney general, a district attorney, or any other law enforcement agency involved in the action.

K. An electronic monitoring provider shall disclose to the commission on any conviction or final administrative or judicial determination involving the provider or its principals related to fraud, public safety, or the provision of monitoring services. Such disclosure shall include the disposition of the matter and shall be made within ten days of the final disposition of the proceeding."
