J. The duration, scope, and application of any such election shall be determined by the governing authority in accordance with the adopted redevelopment plan and applicable law."

K. Any governing authority or designated entity responsible for the administration or investment of property tax revenues pursuant to a redevelopment plan adopted under this Section that includes the use of such revenues to support the redevelopment of blighted or

formerly blighted properties shall be subject to financial oversight, including periodic audits or financial reporting, in accordance with applicable law or as determined appropriate by the governing authority."
