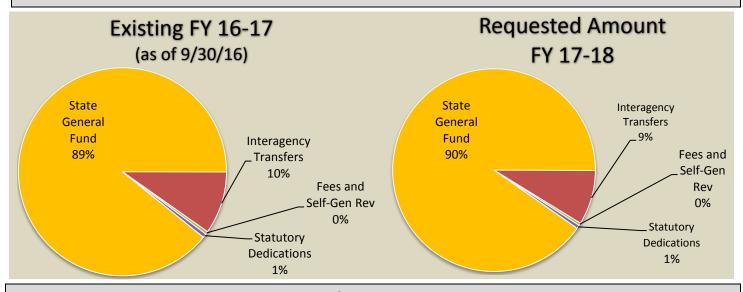

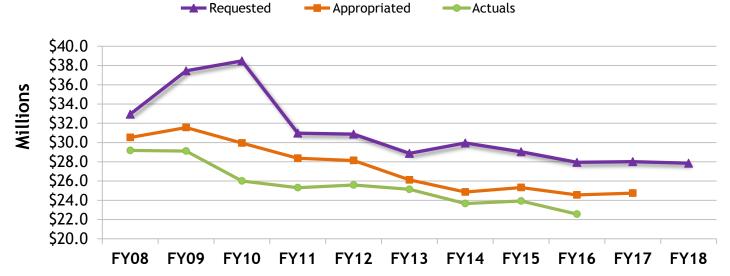

Significant Requests

- No new and expanded requests.
- Staffing:
- No change in authorized positions.
- \$442,944 for merit performance adjustments and related benefits.
- o \$747,907 for salary base adjustments and supplemental pay wages.
- The Administrative and Shared Services Program is requesting \$1.8 million in additional funding for repairs and maintenance. LSDVI operates and maintains 22 buildings, comprising 450,000 square feet, including an elementary school, a junior-senior high school, physical education facilities, vocational and special needs programs, separate dormitory buildings for LSD and LSVI students, a resource center, and various physical plant support and administrative buildings.
 - Significant requests include funding for a new fire alarm system, HVAC system and air handler unit maintenance, a replacement cooling tower and repaired piping, roof repairs, textbooks, asphalt repairs, an upgraded surveillance system, and other projects to maintain the functionality of their facilities.
 - LSDVI is also requesting the replacement of aging vehicles, including one 84 passenger handicap school bus, and two 12 passenger vans.
- The Louisiana School for the Deaf (LSD) is requesting \$34,350 for new dorm furniture and appliances, as well as \$150,000 for an intercom system to provide daily announcements and warnings in case of drills or lockdowns.
- The Louisiana School for the Visually Impaired (LSVI) is requesting \$20,000 for updated cafeteria seating equipment geared towards visually impaired students.

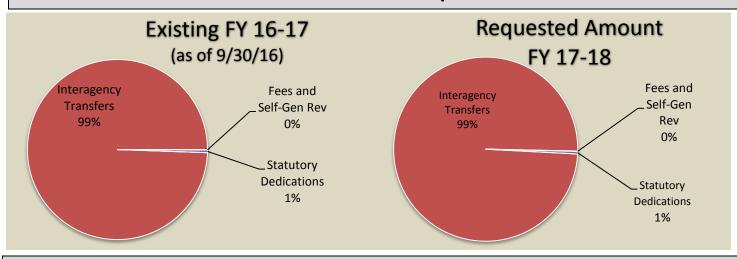

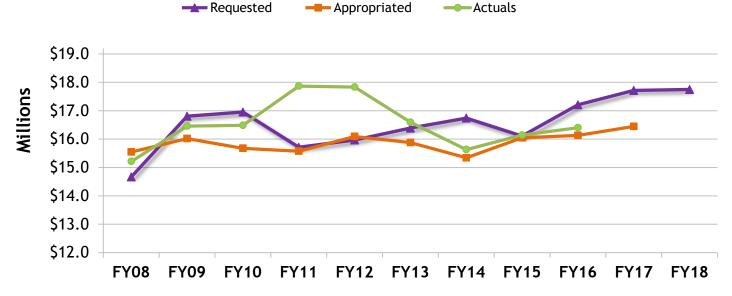

- Staffing:
- No change in authorized positions.
- \$307,927 in IAT for merit performance pay and related benefits.
- The legislature approved 20 new authorized positions for LSEC in FY 2016-17. These additional positions will allow the Center to care for the current 90 students and potentially 10-12 additional students. LSEC is requesting \$879,963 in budget authority to support these new positions.
- LSEC is requesting \$691,656 for acquisitions of durable medical equipment, such as specialized wheelchairs, seating, wheelchair repairs, and occupational and physical therapy equipment.

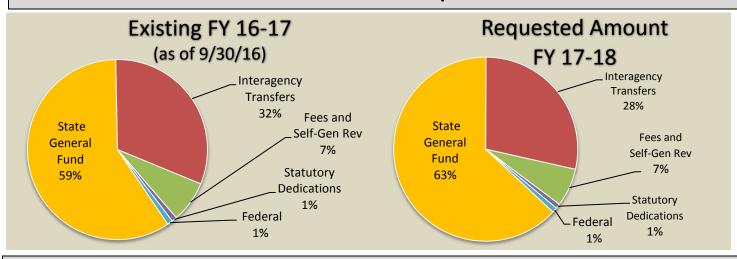

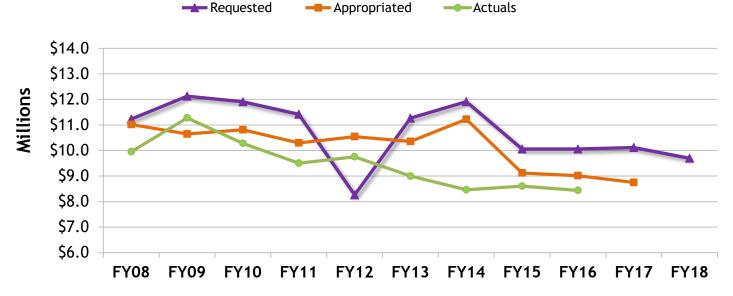

- o Total request for merit pay and related benefits is \$222,651.
- Information Technology LSMSA is requesting \$84,250 to replace 27 classroom computers, 50 faculty laptop computers, and 20 staff desktop computers, all of which are over 10 years old.
- LSMSA is requesting \$80,000 for two 14 passenger school buses.
- LSMSA is requesting \$75,000 for up-to-date college level textbooks.
- LSMSA is requesting \$515,000 for maintenance and repairs, including roof repairs, replaced hot water heaters, repair refractory in boiler, repair and replace chilled water piping, repair stonework and caps, stair-tread replacement, flooring replacement, replaced entry/interior doors, replaced rotting window ledges, and replaced door closers.

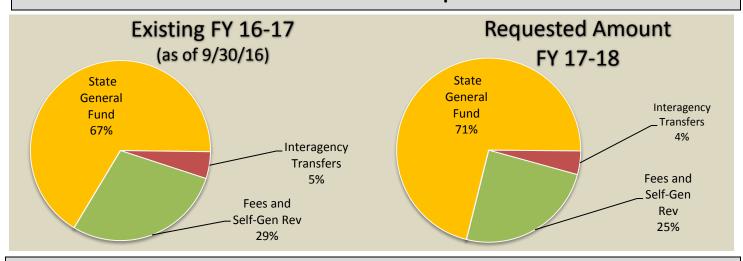

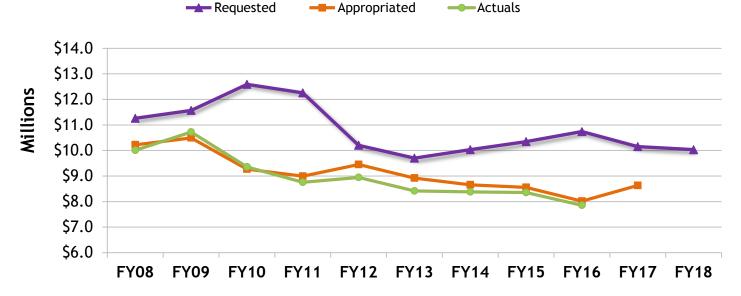

LOUISIANA EDUCATIONAL TELEVISION AUTHORITY

Significant Requests

- Staffing:
- No change in authorized positions.
- LETA is requesting \$419,292 to fill vacant positions.
- \$185,252 for merit pay and related benefits.
- \$70,000 for overtime and termination pay.
- LETA is requesting funding for replacement and maintenance of broadcasting infrastructure. This includes \$7,200 for an anticipated 10% increase in a transmitter tower lease, \$14,000 for backup exciters at two sites, \$125,000 to replace obsolete equipment, \$50,000 for tower maintenance, and \$50,000 to dismantle and demolish an analog tower.
- LETA is requesting \$47,672 to replace two vehicles. One vehicle has over 220,000 miles and the other has over 160,000 miles.
- LETA is required by R.S. 17:2507 to request funds to be distributed to qualified public television and radio stations not licensed to the Authority. Included in their FY 2017-18 Budget Request is a \$704,679 increase for Non-Licensee Public Television and Radio Support. There are 7 public radio stations that qualify, located in Hammond, Lafayette, Monroe, Shreveport, Baton Rouge, and New Orleans, as well as two qualifying public television stations, both in New Orleans: WLAE and WYES.
 - The legislature has not funded this item since FY 2008-09. Following guidelines set in statute, LETA requests the funds to support these station activities.

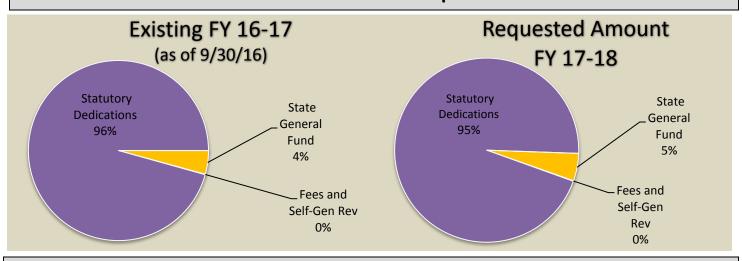

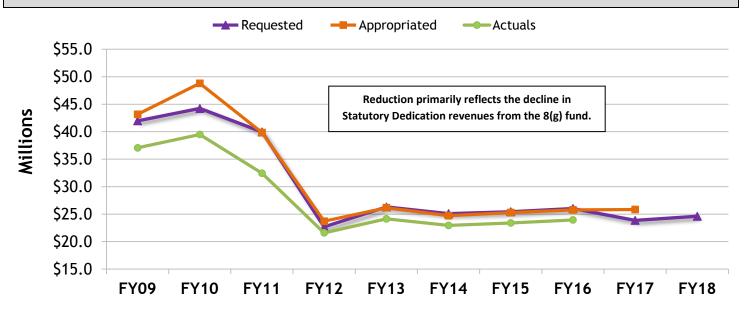

- o Requested merit pay and related benefits total \$42,819.
- BESE is requesting \$97,968 in per diem on behalf of 11 board members.
 - According to R.S. 17:5, each BESE member shall be paid the same per diem provided by law for members of the state legislature for each day of attendance at meetings, plus travel and other necessary expenses incurred in the performance of official duties.
- Louisiana Quality Education Support Fund (8(g)) BESE is requesting a \$1.4 million reduction in Statutory Dedications 8(g) funding to reflect projected collections as determined by the State Treasurer and available carryover funding. This adjustment aligns with the FY 2017-18 program budget adopted by BESE at its Oct. 12, 2016 meeting.

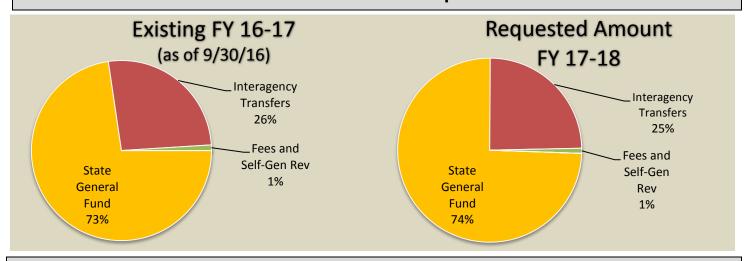

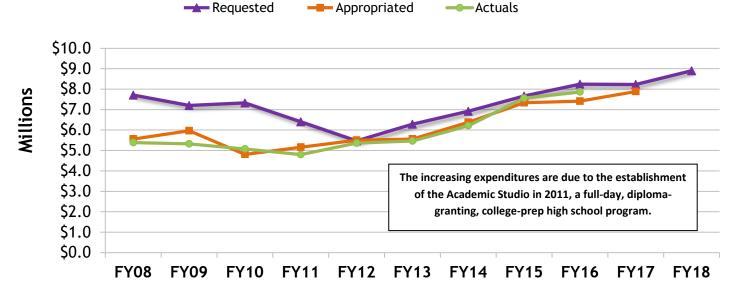

- NOCCA is requesting \$63,316 for an net increase of 1 authorized position. This involves
 moving a Social Worker from a part-time position to a full-time due to increased
 workload, and hiring a part-time Special Education Coordinator to ensure compliance
 with state and federal laws.
- NOCCA is requesting a decrease of \$38,965 associated with an online learning contract due to the addition of a full-time French instructor.
- Operating Services NOCCA is requesting \$290,314 for operating expenses, primarily associated with utilities, maintenance, and building rent.
- Information Technology NOCCA is requesting \$291,208 for the replacement of out-of-date IT equipment.
- Major Repairs NOCCA is requesting \$116,006 for repairs to flooring, roofing, classroom equipment, and performance hall flooring and equipment.

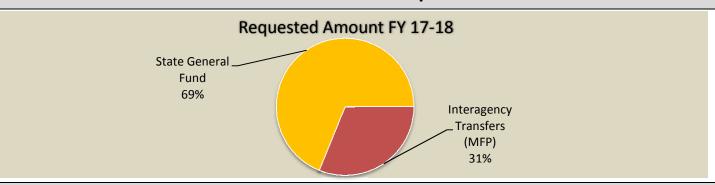

Significant Requests

Act 672 of the 2016 Regular Session established Thrive Academy as an independent, residential, public school in Baton Rouge for at-risk students in grades 6 through 12. Thrive Academy is a special school under the jurisdiction of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. The school has operated as a Type 1 charter school through East Baton Rouge Parish School Board since 2012-13. Currently, 140 students enroll in grades 6-10. Thrive plans to enroll 160 students in grades 6-11 in FY 2017-18.

- Thrive is requesting \$3.2 million in State General Fund and \$1.5 million in Interagency Transfers, which is derived from the Minimum Foundation Program (MFP). Currently, Thrive is not included in the MFP formula in effect, SCR 55 of the 2014 Regular Session. If BESE does not include the school in the proposed FY 2017-18 formula and/or the legislature does not adopt a new formula, full funding would have to be provided through State General Fund appropriations.
- The new agency is requesting 30 authorized positions 28 classified and 2 unclassified. Total requested Salaries and Related Benefits are \$1.5 million.
