La. Municipal Association Black Caucus honors Jackson as Statewide Legislator of the Year

BATON ROUGE, August 5, 2013—State Representative and Chairwoman of the Louisiana Legislative Black Caucus, the Honorable Katrina R. Jackson, honored as Legislator of the Year by the Louisiana Municipal Association (LMABC) Black Caucus. This award, annually given to acknowledge the individual contributions and dedication of a legislative leader in Louisiana, was bestowed upon Representative Jackson Friday, August 2nd at the Louisiana Municipal Associations (LMA) Annual Conference held at the Monroe Civic Center in Monroe, Louisiana. This prestigious award was presented to Chairman Jackson by the Louisiana Municipal Black Caucus Association's Honorable Glenn Green of Westwego.
