HOUSE VOTE (HB71) TURNS CLOCK BACK ON RACE RELATIONS IN LOUISIANA

Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Today the House of Representatives voted to usurp local government authority and decision making power. It was done under the guise of celebrating war heroes, but exposed a deep-rooted belief in White supremacy and racial divisiveness.
